South Park Middle School October 6, 2015

Judge Bob Wortham, 58th District Court, Jefferson County, Texas issued a Judgement on February 4, 2010 commanding that Dr. Carrol Thomas, Beaumont Independent School District, Woodrow Reece and Parsons Commercial Technology Group, Incorporated desist and refrain from using any funds, directly or indirectly, from the November 6, 2007 school board bond election, for the demolition, tear-down, destruction, or dismantling of the former South Park High School and currently known as the South Park Middle School (Exhibit 1). Judge Wortham had issued a Temporary Injunction to the demolition of South Park on August 3, 2009 (Exhibit 2).

The 2007 Bond Project had approved the construction of a new South Park Middle School without the demolition of the existing school. On April 22, 2009, Parsons had provided BISD with a "Cost Model" for this demolition and construction of the existing South Park Middle School. The Cost Model included a line item for Site Demolition and Removal of Existing Building in the amount of \$500,000. This document contains the undated signature of Carrol Thomas (Exhibit 3).

On November 9, 2009, Parsons provided BISD with a Recommendation for Acceptance for the Demolition of Old South Park Middle School. This Recommended of Acceptance was to approve a bid by Allco Construction in the amount of \$135,555 for the demolition. The document was approved by Carrol Thomas on December 7, 2009 (Exhibit 4).

On November 12, 2009, Terry Ingram, BISD Assistant Superintendent for Administrative Operations, submitted a recommendation to Dr. Carrol A. Thomas that the Parson's recommendation to use the Allco bid in the amount of \$135,555 be approved and that the cost would be paid by "bond appropriated funds" (Exhibit 5). The document stated that Parsons and PBK Architects evaluated the bid packages submitted for the demolition. The Board approved the recommendation on November 12, 2009 (Exhibit 6).

On March 15, 2010, Dr. Carrol A. Thomas recommended to the BISD Board of Trustees that the Board approve the demolition of South Park Middle School by Allco in the amount of \$135,555 with the project being paid for from "capital project funds" (Exhibit 7). The body of this memo appears to be consistent with Ingram's memo except for the source of the funds to be expended in that it also states that Parsons and PBK Architects evaluated the bid packages submitted for the demolition.

On March 18, 2010, the BISD Board of Trustees approved the demolition of South Park Middle School with Non-Bond Funds (Exhibit 8).

A "Contractor's Notice to Proceed, dated February 6, 2010, addressed to Allco advised that "your Notice to Proceed" with the demolition of South Park Middle School is effective April 1, 2010 (Exhibit 9). It further states that Keith Schedel of Parsons will be the Project Manager.

Terry Ingram retired from BISD on April 1, 2010.

South Park Middle School was demolished on April 2, 2010 under the oversight of Parsons.

Investigation

Joe Ping, Project Manager of Allco, advised that he oversaw the demolition of South Park Middle School. He advised that he was well aware of the Judgement issued by Judge Wortham to prevent the demolition of South Park Middle School and as such had called BISD counsel Melody Chappell on April 1, 2010 to discuss the issue. Ping stated that Chappell told him that the Judgement had been set aside and that there were no prohibitions against BISD from conducting the demolition of the school.

Terry Ingram advised that he was aware of Judge Wortham's order to not demolish South Park Middle School but was told by someone that he could not remember that the order had been rescinded. He did recall that Carrol Thomas told him to tear down the school.

A financial analysis revealed that Allco was paid the \$135,555 out of non-bond funds to demolish South Park Middle School. There was no evidence of Parsons or PBK Architects submitting any bills for the demolition of the school. Parsons was paid an agreed upon fee for the oversight of the Bond Project. PBK was paid architectural fees under the bond project only.

Conclusion

BISD's Board of Trustees and its Administrators did not honor the representations made by the Board that the South Park Middle School would not be demolished should the 2007 Bond be approved. Further, the Board and Administration did use Bond Funds, after the Temporary Restraining Order issued by Judge Wortham, to plan and oversee the demolition of South Park Middle School when they used Parsons and PB Architects for the planning and oversight of the demolition. The amount of the bond funds expended are contentious since Parsons was paid an agreed upon fee for the total bond project. It is reminded that Parsons did need extensions to their original agreement to finish the Bond Project.

JUDGMENT

This cause came on regularly for trial on September 22 and September 23, 2009.

Plaintiff's, BEAUMONT HERITAGE SOCIETY and EDDIE ESTILETTE appeared in person and by their attorney of record, Michael D. Getz. Defendant's, DR. CARROL THOMAS, BEAUMONT INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT and WOODROW REECE appeared in person and by their attorney of record, Melody G. Chappell. Defendant, PARSONS COMMERCIAL TECHNOLOGY GROUP, INC. was non-suited from this cause prior to the commencement of trial.

No jury was demanded and all issues of fact were tried by the Court.

Having considered the evidence and arguments, the Court finds and concludes that the BEAUMONT HERITAGE SOCIETY and EDDIE ESTILETTE, Plaintiff's, are entitled to the relief hereinafter given.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that

Defendant's DR. CARROL THOMAS, BEAUMONT INDEPENDENT SCHOOL

DISTRICT, WOODROW REECE and PARSONS COMMERCIAL TECHNOLOGY

GROUP, INCORPORATED, be, and hereby are, commanded to desist and

refrain from using any funds, directly or indirectly from the November 6, 2007 school board bond election, for the demolition, tear-down, destruction, or dismantling of the former South Park High School and currently known as South Park Middle School.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that Plaintiff's, BEAUMONT HERITAGE SOCIETY and EDDIE ESTILETTE, shall have and recover from Defendant's, DR. CARROL THOMAS, BEAUMONT INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT, and WOODROW REECE all taxable court costs expended on Plaintiff's behalf in this cause for which let execution issue.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that Plaintiff's, BEAUMONT HERITAGE SOCIETY and EDDIE ESTILETTE, shall have and recover from Defendant's, DR. CARROL THOMAS, BEAUMONT INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT, and WOODROW REECE attorney's fees in the sum of \$42,277.50 for services rendered through the trial of this cause and for the preparation of this Judgment. In the event of an appeal by Defendant's, DR. CARROL THOMAS, BEAUMONT INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT, and WOODROW REECE to the Court of Appeals, if the appeal is unsuccessful, BEAUMONT HERITAGE SOCIETY and EDDIE ESTILETTE will be further entitled to \$8,000.00 as a reasonable attorney's fee; in the event of an appeal by Defendant's, DR. CARROL THOMAS, BEAUMONT INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT, and WOODROW REECE to the Supreme Court of Texas, if the appeal is unsuccessful, BEAUMONT HERITAGE SOCIETY and EDDIE ESTILETTE will be further entitled to \$6,000.00 as a reasonable attorney's fee.

All relief prayed for by any party but not herein expressly given is denied.

The clerk shall forthwith, when so requested by Plaintiff, , BEAUMONT

HERITAGE SOCIETY and EDDIE ESTILETTE, issue a writ of injunction in conformity

with the law and the terms of this judgment.

ORDER GRANTING BEAUMONT HERITAGE SOCIETY AND EDDIE ESTILETTE TEMPORARY INJUCTION

On July 28, 2009, came on to be heard Plaintiff's Application for Temporary Injunctive relief. A full 4 day evidentiary hearing was conducted on July 28, 2009 through July 31, 2009. After hearing the evidence and arguments of counsel, the Court finds that the evidence establishes that the Board of Directors of the Beaumont Heritage Society and Eddie Estilette are resident taxpayers of the Beaumont Independent School District and the rule is settled in our State that a resident taxpayer in a governmental district is entitled to bring a suit to enjoin the public officials from expending public funds illegally. Lawler v. Castroville Rural High School Dist., 233 S.W.2d 613, 616 (Tex.Civ.App.---San Antonio 1950, writ ref'd); Hill v. Stone, 421 U.S. 289, 95 S.Ct. 1637, 44 L.Ed.2d 172 (1975).

The Court finds that Plaintiffs claims may be reasonably construed as alleging that after the bond election was ordered by the Beaumont Independent School District on August 30, 2007, but before it was held, Defendant's stated and pledged to the voters that if the bond issue carried, that the South Park school building would not be demolished and that this statement was intended

by Defendants to cause, and did cause, the bond election to carry; that thereafter Defendants arbitrarily abandoned this promise to the voters and have proceeded to take steps to insure the demolition of the South Park school building.

It is the rule that where the voters have voted bonds relying on a prior order or pledge of the governing board that the proceeds would be used on a certain project "the governing body must not 'arbitrarily ignore or repudiate such order or pledge," Hudson v. San Antonio Independent School District, 127 Tex. 517, 95 S.W.2d 673, 675 (1936).

In this case, the Court finds that the Defendants, through their agents and representatives, caused statements to be disseminated to the electorate in a pamphlet published in a local newspaper that expressly stated that if the 2007 bond passed, that the old South Park building would not be demolished. If a governmental entity induces the voters to approve a bond issue by making certain representations about the issue, it is bound by those representations.

The Court recognizes that there is one case containing a different opinion in Davis v. Duncanville Independent School District, 701 S.W.2d 15 (Tex. .App.-Dallas 1985, writ dism'd w.o.j.) but does not believe the case to be authoritative. The Defendants argue that a governmental entity is bound only by an order or a resolution adopted at a properly convened meeting. The Court has no quarrel with this general proposition. However, a body of law has developed that expressly relates to circumstances like the one before us. Certainly, it is the rule that a governmental body cannot be held to a contract unless the action is an "official" one, regularly enacted at a properly convened meeting. However, the voter reliance cases employ a theory akin to estoppel. Deception may not be perpetrated upon the voters; the electorate may not be misled as to the intended purpose of the bond issue being voted upon.

In the case before us, the Defendants "acquiesced" in the making of specific representations as part of a program to convince the voters that the bonds should be approved. As a matter of good conscience, the Board cannot be

permitted to substantially deviate from its representations without working a deception upon the voters. Consistent with the principles of estoppel, we should not require affirmative action by the District, official or otherwise; we can and should declare that which it may not do. The purpose of the rule requiring that governmental actions be adopted at a duly convened meeting is the preservation of the deliberative process. Each member of the governing body is given an opportunity to contribute his "experience, counsel, and judgment." Webster v. Texas & Pacific Motor Transport, 140 Tex. 131, 166 S.W.2d 75, 77. The goal of judicious deliberation is in no way advanced by applying the rule to the situation before us. Indeed, in a situation where the Defendants allowed public representations to be made in a manner which implied that the District itself would stand by the representations, the orderly conduct of governmental affairs demands that the District be held to the statements. The policy of this State is clear:

In the matter of bond issues authorized by the vote of the citizenship affected, in the submission of the proposition the law encourages rather than frowns upon, a full and definite statement of their purpose. Moore v. Coffman, 109 Tex. 93, 200 S.W. 374 (1918).

Estilette in closing arguments stated they had additional witnesses that would help establish the facts in this case but were unable to produce them because they were unavailable or limited or limited by time due to the length of the hearing. A temporary injunction to allow further evidence to be fleshed out will be a very small incursion upon the powers of the Defendants to conduct school affairs according to its own best judgment and will not substantially delay the construction of a new school at the South Park location whereas to deny the requested injunctive relief will cause the Plaintiffs to suffer immediate and irreparable injury, for which there is no adequate remedy at law.

The Court finds that the harm to Plaintiffs is imminent because demolition contractors are currently preparing to tear down the South Park building and ancillary buildings and there is no adequate remedy at law which will give Plaintiffs complete, final and equal relief because demolition contractors are destroying the very rest of this controversy.

Accordingly, it is ORDERED, that Defendants, BEAUMONT INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT, DR. CARROL THOMAS, WOODROW REECE, Defendants herein, and all of Defendant's officers, agents, servants, employees, agents, servants, contractors, successors and assigns, and attorneys are ORDERED to continue to cease and desist from demolishing the South Park Middle School Main Building and ancillary buildings at 4500 Highland Avenue, Beaumont, Texas from the date of entry of this order.

The trial on the merits and the permanent injunction hearing will be set on September 21, 2009 at 9:00 a.m. A continuation of the bond set for the TRO will be carried along with this trial and injunction hearing.

REPORTS

1. Status of State Comp Ed Funds Report

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

 Progress in Meeting Highly Qualified Teacher Requirements Report — The 2006-2009 High Qualified Teacher Report by state and district was presented for high poverty schools and low poverty schools. The compliance report showed that the district has 3,658 classes taught (98.59%) and 1,484 teachers (99.03%). Across the state and district 100% of teachers are receiving high-quality professional development.

2. Hurricane Ike and Bond 2007 Update Report Hurricane Ike Update

Dr. Thomas stated that the district was still in mediation as far as funding was concern and there are still some details to clear up at both Smith and King Middle Schools.

Bond 2007 Update

Dr. Nantz reported that Building and Grounds Committee had met Monday, November 9, 2009 and received a comprehensive informational notebook for personal and public information use. The remaining Trustees were given notebooks at this Board meeting.

Dr. Thomas asked Mr. Caillouette to address the recovery plan implementation and how funding will be addressed for the rest of the program. Mr. Caillouette stated that the weather delays had challenged the project timeline for the new schools; however, crews were working around the clock to make up this lost time and materials were stocked piled at sites ready for construction. Along with the schedule remaining in good shape, Mr. Caillouette stated that the overall financial program is very healthy; and, even though there were overruns on the first three projects, there are contingencies to cover and offset those events. Mr. Caillouette reported that while the district is not ready to release contingencies, he would like to state that the bond projected budget is conservative and sound.

Mr. Tom Neild questioned the budget numbers on the original yellow colored report. Mr. Caillouette responded that he would like to sit down with him and go over the budget numbers including inflation costs.

Mr. Neild also stated that patrons were concerned that Curtis would not be built at the end of the program. Dr. Thomas responded that there was no possibility that would happen pointing out that a construction manager at risk had been assigned and the budget remains secure with funds designated for a new school at Curtis.

3. E-Rate Funding - Dr. Thomas referred Trustees to a report from Information Services department stating that the combined commitment of the Priority 1 and Priority 2 E-Rate commitment would provide \$688,063.54 in funding for maintenance on network equipment and internet and telecommunications.

4. District TEA Rating – Dr. Thomas presented to Trustees the 2009 TAKS Results and Completion Rate after Appeal including the TPM (Texas Projection Measure). The final AEIS Rating with Gold Performance showed 11 schools exemplary, 8 recognized, 8 academically acceptable and 2 not rated. Dr. Thomas pointed out that the district had also received notification that one of our elementary schools was one of nineteen schools in the state picked for a Blue Ribbon School. Official notification will be announced at a later date as to which school has received this honor.

COMMUNICATIONS

- Michael D. Getz, 7950 Phelan, asked Trustees not to tear demolish the South Park building but rather renovate and provide proper maintenance. Mr. Getz presented photographs of a school in Seattle, Washington that was renovated and its historic preserved.
- 2. Latonya Cheatam, 1031 Schwarner St. (not present)
- Kathy Jones, 719 Alma St., stated her main concern for the children, volunteers, and staff at South Park Middle School was the mold and mildew that are creating unsafe health issues. Ms. Jones asked Trustees to make a decision to tear down the building.
- 4. Lois Turner, 2510 Pierce St. also asked Trustees to demolish the South Park Middle School. Ms. Turner pointed out that if the district wants to be exemplary across the city then administration should consider the surroundings for these students and teachers and provide what is best for them.
- 5. Tina Mitchell, 5770 Kathy Ln., asked for some direction from the Trustees regarding the future for South Park Middle students. Ms. Mitchell stated that these students feel like they have no direction as to where they will be housed the next few years and if they will get a new school building.
